MOVIE REVIEWS



The Simpsons Movie – Family. 87mins (PG13): TV's favourite cartoon family makes its movie debut. After Homer dumps waste in Springfield's recently cleaned-up lake, the town is quarantined off from the world by a giant dome and put on a countdown to destruction. It's up to Homer to save the town and his family.

High School Musical 2 – Family/Musical. 104 mins (PG): The all singing, all dancing high school students return in their second musical movie. School's out for the summer and everyone's spending it at the local country club – some as workers and some as guests. The highlight of the summer will be the club's talent show, which everyone wants to win.

The Nanny Diaries – Family. 106 mins (PG13): Recent college graduate Annie Braddock (Scarlett Johansson) gets a job as a nanny for a wealthy New York family. It's a total change from her working class upbringing in New Jersey and as she juggles a new romance with looking after a spoiled brat, Annie learns life isn't all rosy for the rich.

Sydney White – Family. 90 mins (PG13): The classic tale of Snow White gets a modern twist as college freshman Sydney White (Amanda Bynes) joins her mother's sorority only to find it's degenerated into a party house. Determined to bring some honour back to the college Sydney joins forces with an unlikely group of seven nerdy classmates.

The December Boys – Drama/Romance. 105 mins (PG13): Set in 1960's Australia, this is a coming of age story about four young boys from an outback orphanage who compete for adoption by a local couple during a summer beach holiday. Starring Daniel Radcliffe.

Elizabeth: The Golden Age – Drama. 114 mins (PG13): Australian actress Cate Blanchett reprises her role as the Virgin Queen in this sequel to the film 'Elizabeth'. Focusing on the second half of her life, this time she has to deal with the Spanish threat of war, her treasonous sister Mary, Queen of Scots, and her relationship with Sir Walter Raleigh.

In the Shadow of the Moon – Documentary. 100 mins (PG): Using recent interviews with surviving astronauts and archived footage, including NASA films left unopened for over 30 years, this British documentary offers a compelling insight into the Apollo space program.

Rush Hour 3 – Action. 90 mins (PG13): The third installment in the Rush Hour franchise reunites LAPD Detective James Carter (Chris Tucker) and Chinese Chief Inspector Lee (Jackie Chan) in Paris to fight the Chinese organised crime group, the Triads.

3:10 to Yuma – Action/Drama. 117 mins (R): A remake of the classic 1957 Western. To earn some extra cash a poor rancher joins a posse to ensure a captured murderer boards the 3:10 train to Yuma, where he's due to go on trial. But between skirmishes with local Apaches and the outlaw's evil gang in pursuit, getting him on the train is no easy task. With Russell Crowe and Christian Bale.

The Kingdom – Action/Drama. 110 mins (R): Jamie Foxx plays an FBI agent who leads a small team on an undercover mission to Riyadh to investigate a suicide bombing at an American compound that killed more than 100 oil-company employees and family members.

MOVIE REVIEWS



The Simpsons Movie – Family. 87 mins (PG13): TV's favourite cartoon family makes its movie debut. After Homer dumps waste in Springfield's recently cleaned-up lake, the town is quarantined off from the world by a giant dome and put on a countdown to destruction. It's up to Homer to save the town and his family.

Hairspray – Family/Musical. 117 mins (PG): When teenager Tracy Turnblad wins an audition to be on a TV music show her arch rival, Amber Von Tussle, and her scheming mother plot to ruin her. It's a musical with a twist! Starring John Travolta, Michelle Pfeiffer, Zac Efron and Amanda Bynes.

Ratatouille – Family. 111 mins (PG): Remy is a French country bumpkin rat with high-class food aspirations. Luckily for Remy he ends up in Paris living near one of France's most famous restaurants – but can a rat really become a successful city chef?

Resurrecting the Champ – Drama/Sport. 111 mins (PG13): Erik (Josh Hartnett), a junior sports reporter, rescues a homeless man called Champ (Samuel L. Jackson) and discovers he's a famous boxer long-thought dead. What begins as a chance for Erik to push his own career becomes a personal journey where he must consider what is really important in life.

Sicko – Documentary. 123 mins (PG13): A fascinating documentary by Michael Moore that takes a close up look at the private, profit-orientated healthcare systems in the United States and compares them to the free public healthcare programmes offered in Canada, the U.K and France.

The Bourne Ultimatum – Action/Adventure. 115 mins (PG13): When reporter Simon Ross tries to unveil Operation Black Briar, Bourne (Matt Damon) is forced to come out of hiding. Once again he finds himself battling The Company, while at the same time coming to terms with his own murky past.

The 11th Hour – Documentary. 95 mins (PG13): A compelling look at the global environment and the impact of the human footprint to date, the documentary provides practical solutions for restoring the earth's ecosystems. Narrated by Leonardo DiCaprio.

The TV Set – Comedy/Drama. 88 mins (R): Mike's brother has committed suicide and he's come up with a quirky idea for a TV sitcom based on the aftermath of the death. A TV network agrees to make a pilot of the show, but the initial concept gets left behind as filming progresses and the network asks for change after change.

This is England – Drama. 101 mins (R): It's 1983 in Thatcher's Britain and 12-year-old Shaun is facing his summer alone till he meets up with Woody and his skinhead mates and discovers girls and parties. It's all fun and games until Combo appears on the scene, fresh from prison, bitter, dangerous, racist, and militant.

The Darjeeling Limited – Adventure/Comedy. 91 mins (R): Three estranged brothers take a train trip across India in an effort to rekindle their friendship. Starring Owen Wilson and Adrian Brody.
